



The town through our public works department has started to upgrade some of our underground infrastructure. This was not an easy task for some pieces of the system were quite old and could not be easily replaced. They did persevere and completed the project. To all those affected, I thank you for your patience. We are very fortunate to have a public works department that are able and willing to take on these huge tasks.

Starting September 20, two of our doctors will be taking time off to prepare for their medical exams. Our remaining two doctors are stepping up to keep the clinic and emergency department open. Both areas as you know, are very busy during normal operations. We are working with all groups to find some extra help for them but there is a doctor shortage all over the province. These individuals will be doing their best to keep everything running. A heartfelt thank you to both of them for keeping health services running in our community.

The refrigeration system for the arena and curling rink has served us well for many decades but the time has come to replace it. The cost of replacement will be in the million dollar range. We have received a grant already for \$352,000. We have had some preliminary discussions with the county. They stated that they are in favor of the upgrade. They are not prepared to commit any monetary funds without seeing any fundraising for the project from within the community. This will be the challenge to all groups to help raise additional funds for the upgrade. Rest assured that the town will be applying for every grant available to make this upgrade possible. Without your support in raising funds for this upgrade, it appears that the town may have to do this project on its' own.
