Hello everyone, I hope this month's newsletter finds you all well. The month of July has seen a lot of heat advisories and many days of smoke-filled air. The dry weather has helped our busy Public Works department continue with our sidewalk and road improvements. The lack of moisture though has affected our surrounding neighbours. Our farmers are experiencing drought conditions which does not bode well for any of us. Here's hoping that rain does come to help save what can be saved at this point.

We had our first advisory of the season. This advisory was sent out to help conserve water. Our water comes from the City of Edmonton (EPCOR). These advisories are meant to conserve water consumption for domestic use. It would be devastating if there would be very little water for use in our homes because certain residents did not follow restrictions. If you see people that are not adhering to the advisories, please report it to the Town office. We can live with brown lawns but not without water.

The premier brought to the County Reeves' attention and he passed it on to me, The County of Two Hills is one of the highest unvaccinated area in the province. This is not for a shortage of vaccinations but the individuals choosing not to become vaccinated. Many of us have taken the vaccine thus helping to protect the ones who have chosen not to.
