

- 1. Risk Management Session with 13 Ways.** Council & I are meeting with Doug Griffiths & Golnaz Azimi for the second one day workshop on Wednesday September 16<sup>th</sup>, dealing with risk management in our municipality for infrastructure replacement.
- 2. Meeting with MLA Jackie Armstrong-Homeniuk.** The Mayor, Deputy Mayor & I will be meeting with our MLA on Friday September 11<sup>th</sup> to discuss the state of infrastructure in the Town of Two Hills. We will be talking about the cost of replacement, sources for funding, other ideas and a long term replacement plan for infrastructure. We are not unique in the large amount of infrastructure debt to replace old water & sewer lines and then pave the broken up road surfaces and replace crumbling sidewalks.
- 3. Sidewalk Replacement and Curb & Gutter.** The Town of Two Hills has replaced a few blocks of sidewalks with curb & gutter this summer. The Town has filled the space where there was sidewalk with dirt. Then the homeowner has either seeded grass or puts sod at their own expense. Should the town give an amount of money to compensate for this, since they will not have a new sidewalk.
- 4. SB-90 Road Work.** The Town of Two Hills Public Works have been busy working on three sections of road that are almost done. A good job has been done on these roads. Two more blocks of road are planned to be done, time and weather permitting.
- 5. Natural Gas & Power Franchise Fees Analysis.** The analysis for the Town of Two Hills is complete. To raise the rates to the average in the province, the rate for both needs to be doubled and more revenue will be generated.
- 6. Two Hills Swimming Pool.** Insurance has informed us that they will not be covering any of the cost to fix the damage to the roof caused by water leaks. What should be done moving forward? Does the community want to fix the building or close the building and tear it down.
- 7. Municipal Stimulus Program (MSP).** The economic impact of COVID-19 is unprecedented. The provincial government has taken steps to stimulate the economy and support municipalities. The \$500 million Municipal Stimulus Program (MSP) was recently announced as part of Alberta's recovery plan. In talking with a grant advisor from Municipal Affairs, we are able to use our \$171,000 for crushing of concrete.
