Mayor's Column

On behalf of administration and council, I would like to apologize for the February water bills. Due to the new meter readers being installed, there were two bills generated. One was for the end of the old meter reading and the other was the beginning of new meter reading. For some reason, some bills had monthly charges on both when they should have been prorated. If you have been affected, please visit the office and administration will correct this issue for you. Going forward, we hope to have this unforeseen problem rectified.

Every week grocery stores put products on special to entice people to come and shop. These products are called lost leaders. Communities do something similar, but it is year round and it is the operation of recreational facilities. The recreational area has a wide range of facilities for use by town and county residents. Trying to run these facilities at affordable prices is where the problem occurs.

Each year the costs of insurance, utilities and maintenance in these facilities rises. While volunteer groups help raise funds for some of the operations, the town's portion this year will be well over \$400,000. A provincial grant for recreation of \$100,000 is given to the county to divide over the region. What part of the recreational grant and how much each group receives, is figured out by the county. The town does receive some of these funds plus an unrestricted \$75,000 from the county. This still does not diminish the fact that the town is taking on more of the costs every year to keep these facilities running. We as a council feel that the unrestricted grant should be larger. To keep these facilities operational and affordable falls on both municipal governments to do their part. Hopefully the county will agree, so that we can continue to offer these facilities for everyone's use at affordable rates.
